The 2023 Australian Liveability Census provides a unique opportunity for community members to have their say on issues that matter most to us in our local neighbourhoods.

Whether it's access to green space, car parking, or improving public safety, your voice will help guide decision making in our area at the same time as contributing to national research regarding liveability.

City of Victor Harbor Mayor, Dr Moira Jenkins, said anyone can take part in the research and it doesn't take long to complete the short survey.

"Hearing from our community is extremely important to help Council with decision-making. That's why we are often asking residents and ratepayers to complete surveys or share their thoughts, feelings and ideas," said Mayor Jenkins.

"In this instance, the information gathered from the Liveability Census will give Council an idea of what makes Victor Harbor so great, and what can be improved."

"The survey asks a wide range of questions, including what makes a neighbourhood liveable in your opinion. You'll also get the chance to rate Victor Harbor in terms of liveability."

"I really encourage you to get involved and share this opportunity with your friends and family too! In just 15 minutes you can have a positive impact on the future planning of Victor Harbor."

The 2023 Australian Liveability Census is open until Friday, 30 June 2023.

All participants have the chance to win one of 50 x \$100 vouchers.

In the 2021 Liveability Census, over 32,000 responses were collected from people all across Australia. This year the target is 50,000, and Council would like to see as many responses as possible from the City of Victor Harbor area.
