PURPOSE

The purpose of the Informal Gathering is to provide updates on key strategic development projects.

AGENDA

- Business SA/Business Victor Harbor presentation (30 minutes) (OPEN)
 - A presentation will be provided by Business Victor Harbor and Business SA on the extent of engagement, business support activities delivered since mid-May and a local business health assessment.
- Environmental Management Plan (30 minutes) (OPEN)
 - Council adopted the Environmental Management Plan in September 2019. An overview on the current Action Plan and proposed program for 2020/21 will be presented.
- Fleurieu Peninsula Tourism (30 minutes) (OPEN)
 - At the 27 May 2019 Council meeting, the Council resolved to continue with a funding commitment to support Fleurieu Peninsula Tourism for a further three years. The commitment was on the basis of a review into the structure, funding model and service delivery of Fleurieu Peninsula Tourism to occur within the first year of the agreement. A report is proposed to be tabled at the July 2020 Council meeting seeking endorsement to proceed with the recommended service delivery model and work plan to be implemented over the forthcoming year.

- Strategic Infrastructure Planning (30 minutes) (CLOSED)
 - The manner in which visitors research and consume visitor information has changed significantly, reducing the reliance on face-to-face visitor services. The attached workshop report aims to initiate a conversation with Council around visitor services, while outlining a future method of how the Council delivers visitor services, that are more reflective to changes in the market.
