2022 Council Elections Results: Area Councillors

The results from the City of Victor Harbor's Area Councillor election have been announced.

Nineteen candidates contested nine vacancies, with the following candidates provisionally declared elected to the Council:

- Brayden Mann (1,544 first preference votes)
- Stewart Burns (650 first preference votes)
- Michael Quinton (435 first preference votes)
- Marilyn Henderson (463 first preference votes)
- David Kemp (418 first preference votes)
- Angela Schiller (385 first preference votes)
- Carlos Quaremba (317 first preference votes)
- Carol Schofield (295 first preference votes)
- Nick McKenzie (176 first preference votes)

The Local Deputy Returning Officer made the provisional declaration for the City of Victor Harbor's Area Councillor election on Tuesday night.

Detailed results will be published on the Electoral Commission of South Australia's website at **www.ecsa.sa.gov.au** as soon as possible.

Unsuccessful candidates may request a recount within 72 hours of the provisional declaration. The Electoral Commission of South Australia decides if a recount is required, and can also initiate a recount within the same period.

Voting for the 2022 Council Elections closed at 5pm on Thursday, 10 November 2022 and 46.16% of eligible voters in the City of Victor Harbor returned their ballot papers.

The City of Victor Harbor would like to thank all community members who participated in the 2022 Council Elections, as well as outgoing Councillors for their service to the community over the past four years.

The City of Victor Harbor's Mayor and Councillors will make a declaration of office at an inaugural Council meeting to be held on Wednesday, 23 November 2022 from 5:30pm at the City of Victor Harbor Civic Centre (1 Bay Road, Victor Harbor).
