6 ISSUES FOR STRATEGY AND PLANNING

6.1 New aged care reforms

We will be co-hosting another combined regions Forum on 22 October 2021. This Forum is being held in the Fleurieu area at Chiton Rocks Surf Lifesaving Club, and will focus on Workforce. An exciting format is planned for an interesting and engaging day. Refer to Item 9.1 for further details.

6.2 COVID-19 response

Focus on covid-19 vaccine record keeping and reporting requirements. Roy reported that South Australia is last compared to other states in terms of reporting numbers. Reminder to only count staff once, if staff work across more than one program just count them under one program. Also encouraged providers to update outlet information, to assist with accuracy of data.

Julie stated that Goolwa Medical Centre is doing lots of after-hours vaccinations with good uptake from the community. Local pharmacies are also offering vaccinations.

In 2 Phases:

- Phase 1:

- Dept of Health has engaged Department of Education, Skills and Employment (DESE) to roll out Phase 1.
- Includes: Home Care – Job Fairs, Helping Job seekers understand the sector so they can make a more informed choice and minimise staff lost after completing qualifications.
- Registered Nurses [retention bonuses](#) – As per recent media coverage.

- Phase 2:

- \$91million for [Nine grants](#) (closed 27/9/21) to attract, train and retain approximately 13,000 new PCW. Draft guidelines are on Grant Connect (have to log in).
- 33,800 additional training places for Cert III or higher. This expands on existing training initiatives. DOH is in discussions with State and Territory governments the roll out of this initiative. Look to [MySkills](#) website

The department has been working the Human Services Skills Organisation (DESE) to link approximately 3,000 people with Certificate IIIs who have not been able to complete their placements with aged care providers who have nominated to take students.

A free and confidential [Workforce Advisory Service](#) (this page has a Fact Sheet and a link to the PWC advisory service website) that can assist providers with workforce training, skills and retention plans and strategies. The Workforce Advisory Service complements the free and confidential PWC [Business advisory service](#).

- The first 15 of 70 [Aged Care Specialists](#) will be operational by 31 October 2021, located in Service Australia Offices. The first one in SA will be at Norwood. Aged Care Specialists will be the third Channel for aged people to interact with My Aged Care, in addition to telephoning and on-line. There will also be 10 outreach services that will travel into regional Australia. This is in addition to the 325 face to face services available at Services Australia to help people use the online channel and the 500 local Community Care Finders, enhanced advocacy and other mechanisms included

in the initiative. The Aged Care System Navigator services will be extended to December 2022 until the Community Care Finders start.

7.2 Country SA Primary Health Network update – Sara Manser

- Ageing Well EOI process is complete with three successful organisations having been chosen to move into contract negotiation. Service to be commissioned are around service navigation, dementia specific palliative care & online group exercise sessions. Announcement of these by next PATF meeting.

HealthPathways offers clinicians locally agreed information to make the right decisions together with patients, at the point of care. The pathways are designed primarily for general practice teams, but are also available to specialists, allied health professionals, and other health professionals in your region. Frailty pathway to go live soon - 22% of country SA PHN region population is 65+ with projected increases and 96% live at home. Over 3,400 people in country SA over 65 were admitted to public hospitals for falls in 2018-2019.

- Goolwa Victor Harbor Village Hub: grant was successful. Currently recruiting Hub Manager. The Village Hub will bring together a network of older people to work together for each other and their community. The Hub will offer peer-to-peer volunteering and support, ageing well activities and events, information and support to access services, advocacy and representation about issues that matter to older people, as well as social opportunities between members. The Hub will draw its members from older people living in the Southern Fleurieu, including Goolwa, Victor Harbor, Port Elliot, Middleton, Hindmarsh Island, Encounter Bay, McCracken and Hayborough. The initial funding, until June 2024, will help establish the not-for-profit Hub, with membership fees and charges for some programs, activities, and services assisting with running costs over time. COTA SA will establish the Hub, including setting up a governance structure, an activity program, volunteer training, and member recruitment during the first two years, before transitioning to management by its members in the third year.

10 DEMENTIA FRIENDLY COMMUNITITES

10.1 Dementia Friendly Communities Community Information Session (Helen/Jo)

A community information session hosted by Caring Neighbourhood Program was held on 1 September. Guest speakers were Liz Withall from Dementia Australia, a local carer, and a volunteer who hosted a Dementia Friends session. The purpose of the session was to facilitate conversation to build a foundation to foster a dementia-inclusive community. Key outcomes were: people expressing interest in running 'Dementia Friends sessions', Dementia Australia planning to hold education sessions next year, discussions about a Memory Café, and other programs offered by Dementia Australia. An email was distributed to attendees following the Information Session outlining current dementia programs and initiatives.

It is a safe and supportive environment for people living with dementia to meet, socialise and share their experiences with people that can relate and understand. 11 NEW AND EMERGING ISSUES / OPPORTUNITIES

11.1 Aligning regulation across the care and support sector (Michelle Brunton)

The Australian Government is seeking to align regulation across the aged care, disability support and veterans' care sectors. The 2021-22 Budget encompasses a range of measures including short to long term program reforms. For further details about the program, please see the fact sheet and Background Paper available at [web page](#).

Aligning regulation will strengthen protections to ensure quality and safety for participants and consumers across the care and support sectors, while making it easier for service providers and workers to meet regulatory requirements to deliver services across the sectors.

Consultation on regulatory alignment is occurring in three stages:

- o Stage 1 - workshops with providers and peak bodies in mid-October
- o Stage 2 - release of a consultation paper, written submission, online survey, workshops for all other stakeholders and the broader community in late October
- o Stage 3 - Release Consultation Findings - early 2022

A staged consultation approach will enable providers and peak bodies to provide industry-specific considerations on regulatory alignment, which will inform the broader consultation process. Tailored approaches to engage with consumers and carers will be developed in parallel and implemented as part of Stage 2.

- Meals on Wheels SA is committed to providing a meal delivery service to all elderly members of our metro and regional communities, who require help with nutritional meals, as a part of continuing to live independently in their own homes.
- Whilst COVID has and continues to present many challenges to our service, we are proud to say not one of our valued customers has gone without a meal (on average we deliver around 4,000 meals every weekday throughout SA).

- Meals on Wheels can deliver meals hot ready to eat and frozen for convenience. Customers can also receive meals to cater for special diets and chewing and swallowing difficulties. Our meals are nutritionally balanced, offer a wonderful variety and are prepared and delivered in line with Food Safety Standard 3.3.1 (covering the preparation, storage and delivery of food to vulnerable people).
- Meals on Wheels' more than 7,000 volunteers in both our kitchens and delivery drivers, are a truly dedicated group of people who genuinely care about the well-being of elderly community members still living at home. No meal is ever delivered without an invaluable well-being check on every customer.

The following updates have been provided by Taskforce members for inclusion in the minutes.

Southern Volunteering SA Inc – Lynne Arbon

Southern Volunteering are now more mobile throughout the Fleurieu with appointments being held at the Connect Victor Office in Victor Harbor along with local café's and hubs throughout the Fleurieu. Our Community Visitors Scheme (CVS) is a free service to help older people living in residential aged care homes maintain social connection through a weekly or fortnightly visit from one of our CVS volunteers. The Community Visitor Scheme is available to all Residential Aged Care Homes (including those without a not for profit status). ECH – Victoria Cornell

- Each year ECH seeks to understand the diversity of its staff, volunteers and leadership team through the Annual Diversity Survey; the survey is currently underway with all staff and volunteers.
- A new Marketing campaign promoting Billy, ECH's in-home sensor product, direct to consumers kicked off on Monday 6 September. The campaign, initially being tested in South Australia, includes a 30 sec radio ad which is airing on Mix FM along with a 90sec, 30sec and 15sec video ad which is going out across Facebook and other digital platforms.
- In July, ECH opened the new ECH Care Hotel at College Grove, called 'Dandelion'. 'Dandelion' is a proof of concept hotel designed to challenge the current limitations in existing care models, minimise hospital visits and to empower and treat people as individuals. Moving away from the current 'one size fits all' thinking in relation to care, the focus is to allow people to have the power to make their own choices in relation to their overall health and wellbeing. Throughout this proof-of-concept, ECH will determine the long-term viability of this model of care and make any necessary adjustments before offering this service to a much larger cross section of the community. 'Dandelion' currently features sixteen suites - eight short stay suites for people transitioning from hospital who may need more frequent care than they can get at home, and eight suites for people experiencing dementia to provide respite for carers.
- ECH is in the final stages of completion of 'Encore', at Modbury. This innovative intergenerational, mixed business, commercial and housing development will include 77 two-bedroom apartments, a gym, allied health care services, a café (already operational), a community garden and a Montessori care and education environment. The first residents are due to move in mid-October.
- Most community/ wellness/ social programs are back up and running, with covid restrictions as necessary.
