Preventing cyber crime with South Australia Police

The Victor Harbor Library is partnering with Hills Fleurieu Police to equip the community with knowledge about scams.

Representatives from Hills Fleurieu Police will be visiting the Library (1 Bay Road, Victor Harbor) at 2pm on Tuesday, 5 September 2023 for a Cyber Crime Prevention Presentation.

The free presentation is a chance to learn tips for identifying common scams and reduce your chances of becoming a cyber crime victim. By the end of the free seminar, attendees will have increased awareness of how scammers work and the potential impacts of scams.

Senior Constable Lucas Perry from South Australia Police's Hills Fleurieu Local Service Area said they are committed to working in partnership with the community to prevent crime and reduce the fear of crime.

"This is a chance to learn about your online safety which includes various scam methodologies and prevention strategies. We'll present information on how to identify red flags, what to look for in regard to phishing attempts and information on password security," said Senior Constable Perry.

"By being smarter with your data, verifying the source or knowing how to spot scams you can help protect yourself from losing your identity, your reputation or your life savings."

Every year, scams cost the Australian public hundreds of millions of dollars and cause serious emotional harm to victims and their families. Fittingly, the Cyber Crime Prevention Presentation will take place during Adult Learners Week.
