INFORMATION

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide Elected Members with a summary of the first stage of public consultation for the development of the City of Victor Harbor's new Community Plan, and outline the proposed next steps for the completion of the plan.

Background

The City of Victor Harbor has a number of plans it has developed and adopted to assist with the management of the Council area. Once of these plans is the Community Plan which sets out aspirations for the Council area and what needs to be in place in order to achieve these aspirations. It is a requirement of the *Local Government Act 1999* that Council reviews its strategic management plan (Community Plan) within two years of an election. Council is currently undertaking this review.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

A consultation discussion paper was subsequently prepared to assist gather feedback and ideas from the community. A copy of the consultation discussion paper is provided as Attachment A.

Public consultation on the strategic directions commenced on Thursday, 23 January 2020 and concluded on Friday, 14 February 2020. An engagement report that includes a summary of the consultation and raw data (responses to the quick survey, detailed survey and conversation kits is provided under separate cover as Attachment B.

The feedback gathered through the consultation process indicates that Council is generally on the right track with the strategic directions (aspirations and strategies). Some gaps have been identified, and will be addressed as the four year priorities are populated. This work is currently being undertaken and will be presented back to Council at a workshop in April before coming back to Council for endorsement to go to the second round of consultation with the community.

The second round of consultation will occur at the same time as the 2020/21 Annual Business Plan and Budget. There are many benefits of aligning these consultations including being able to demonstrate how the Community Plan will link with the annual business planning process.

RISK ASSESSMENT

The following risks have been assessed in line with Council's Risk Management Framework and Policy:

Socio Political, Community Issues / Reputation – It is unlikely that receiving the consultation report will generate any negative media or community concern. This risk is assessed as *low*.

Corporate Governance – It is unlikely there will be a negative impact from receiving the consultation report as it has taken into consideration legislative requirements. This risk is assessed as *low*.

Following Local Government elections in November 2018, all councils are required to review their strategic management plans (Community Plan) within two years. The City of Victor Harbor is currently undertaking this review, and preparing a new Community Plan.

PREPARING OUR COMMUNITY PLAN

Our community is at the heart of our planning.

Over the past few years the City of Victor Harbor has conducted a number of significant engagement activities where we asked our community to share their thoughts and ideas with us. We have collected a significant amount of feedback relating to a number of different topics and issues including arts and culture, economic development, infrastructure, environment, community engagement, sport and recreation, plus many more.

We have listened to what our community said and have addressed this in our proposed aspirations for Victor Harbor's future. Based on our community's priorities, we also developed a number of high level strategies that will help us achieve our aspirations.

The review of the City of Victor Harbor Community Plan will be undertaken in stages:

ROLE OF COUNCIL

Everything that Council does helps to shape the future of Victor Harbor. The role that Council takes on varies depending on the circumstances including legal requirements, relative priorities and funds available. These roles can be considered as a spectrum, starting from having no role right through to being the service provider or asset owner. The resourcing requirements tend to increase as the spectrum moves from no role through to service provider.

For services where Council does have a role, these roles can be described either as an enabler or a provider. In addition to this, the Council has a role as a community leader through strategic planning, policy development and decision making.

The council roles spectrum is outlined below:

NO ROLE		The Council chooses not to have a role in relation to a particular service or activity
	Information Channel	Information about a service or activity of other bodies is channelled through Council communications activities
ENABLER	Advocate	The Council may advocate to another government or other organisation for certain things to happen. This could range from a single event (such as writing to a Minister) through to an ongoing campaign
	Facilitator	A step further from advocacy where the Council may try to bring parties together to work out a solution to an issue affecting the Council area
	Agent	Typically this would involve the Council delivering a service, funded by a government agency, that is (or likely to be regarded as) the responsibility of another government
	Part Funder	The Council either provides funding to another body to meet part of the cost of that body providing a function/service activity, or receives funding from another body (usually a government agency) to meet part of the cost of the Council delivering it
PROVIDER	Asset Owner	As the owner (or custodian) of an asset (road, footpath, building, playground, etc.) the Council has responsibility for capital, operating and maintenance costs.
	Regulator	The Council has legislated roles in a range of areas which it is required to fund from its own funds (apart from fees for cost recovery, government grants)
	Service Provider	The full cost (apart from fees for cost recover, government grants etc.) for a service or activity is met by Council
LEADER		The Council has a role as a community leader through strategic planning, policy development and decision making



OUR PLANNING FRAMEWORK

The Community Plan 2030 will be the City of Victor Harbor's guiding strategic document, outlining the community's aspirations for the future. It will set out our

long term goals, medium term priorities, and the measures we will use to monitor our progress.

The plan incorporates a ten year strategic directions component that articulates aspirations for Victor Harbor and the strategies that need to be in place to help achieve them. A rolling four year action plan will sit under the strategic directions outlining key projects and initiatives that will be undertaken to help achieve the community's aspirations.

Projects and Actions

The strategic directions and action plan are informed by a number of supporting documents including the Council's Long Term Financial Plan and Asset Management Plans. The Council also has a range of other plans, such as Victor Harbor Urban Growth Management Strategy, Environmental Management Strategy, Bicycle Strategy and Mainstreet Precinct Master Plan amongst many others which inform our community strategic planning. Our planning also takes into consideration State and Regional plans such as the 30 Year Plan for Greater Adelaide, SA Public Health Plan, State Disability Inclusion Plan and Resilient Hills and Coasts Climate Adaptation Plan.

As a part of this consultation, Council is seeking community feedback on the strategic directions (aspirations and strategies), and asking the community to share what actions they think need to be undertaken to achieve the aspirations. This will help us prepare the new Community Plan.

Strategic context:

Victor Harbor is well known for its welcoming, friendly and family focussed community. Council's planning recognises this and outlines strategies to ensure that this continues in the future. In addition to the caring nature of our community, people also often comment that they feel safe in Victor Harbor and that it is a great place for children to grow up.

There is a strong volunteer culture within the City of Victor Harbor. One in three people in the local government area volunteer in some capacity, and the Council is fortunate to have a team of around 500 volunteers assisting with the delivery of services, programs and initiatives. The high level of volunteerism results in a healthy number of thriving community groups, clubs and organisations, all which provide important opportunities for people to feel valued and included.

Victor Harbor and its surrounds is growing with the population set to increase from 15,100 to 21,000 by 2031. This growth will have implications for the provision of services and infrastructure, as well as how we protect our environment, heritage, lifestyle and sense of community, all of which are highly valued and integral to our city's appeal. Population growth in neighbouring councils will also impact on the City of Victor Harbor which has firmly established itself as the service centre for the region. Appropriate planning will assist to maintain this position, at the same time as preserving the attributes of our city that we most value.

The Victor Harbor economy is heavily reliant upon the income derived from tourism. This income is largely seasonal, providing a challenge for some local businesses to manage revenue fluctuations. There is potential for this sector of the economy to be developed, as well as opportunities to see the growth in other sectors such as aged care, agriculture, building and construction and manufacturing.

What our community has told us in past consultations:

- While there is an understanding that Victor Harbor will continue to grow, people want to see the growth managed carefully to ensure our city keeps its charm and identity
- · We need more opportunities for employment, study and vocational training in Victor Harbor
- Our Indigenous culture should be celebrated more prominently within our community

The City of Victor Harbor council area is home to many wonderful assets such as Rosetta Head (The Bluff), Granite Island and the Little Penguin colony, Hindmarsh Falls, Glacier Rock, Inman and Hindmarsh Rivers. The natural environment, including the coastal and marine areas, rivers, natural vegetation, clean air and mild climate are all identified as things that make Victor Harbor a great place to live.

Our planning aims to preserve all of the things we value about our environment, at the same time as putting measures in place to address the challenges that face us in the future. Urban growth will place pressure on the natural environment, as well as the general landscape and built form character.

Climate change is forecast to impact on our future climate with warmer and drier conditions, more frequent extreme weather events, and higher sea levels. A better understanding of both climate variability and climate change will mean the community can better manage the adverse impacts and take advantage of any opportunities that arise.

What our community has told us in past consultations:

- Our natural environment is highly important to our lifestyle and needs to be cared for so it can continue to be enjoyed by the community in years to come
- There is support for initiatives that reduce, recycle and reuse waste
- · We love the access we have to natural areas, and sites thriving with plants, birds and animals
- It's important to be prepared for the potential impacts of climate change
- Sustainable development is important in order to protect the town setting, landscapes and 'areas of outstanding beauty'

Our community considers infrastructure such as roads, footpaths, walking trails, bike paths and playgrounds as important for quality of life.

Access to health and community services is also highly important to the community. The average age of people in Victor Harbor is 58 years, with children aged 0-14 making up 13% of the population, while 39% are aged over 65. The type and level of services, infrastructure and housing required to support our ageing population is a key component of our planning. This is balanced against the needs of young families who are being drawn to the area through increasing capital investments in the four local schools.

Council owns and maintains a large range of assets including buildings, bridges, roads and open spaces. Management of existing and new assets can be increasingly challenging for Council. For example, cost shifting for services and new legislative provisions from federal and state governments to local government impacts on the Council's ability to provide services and facilities.

Council has long been advocating for improved transport networks, particularly enhancing the Victor Harbor to Adelaide Road. This section of road is highly important to the local Victor Harbor economy, as a major commuter, tourist and freight route.

What our community has told us in past consultations:

- · Better roads and footpaths are a priority
- There are improvements to be made to car parking and traffic management in the town centre
- It's important to look at other ways to fund improved infrastructure including other revenue sources and government grants
- . Improved transport is highly important not only to our way of life but to the local economy



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY: COMMUNITY PLAN (STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS)

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to provide details of the community consultation undertaken in relation to the development of the City of Victor Harbor's new Community Plan. It outlines a summary of the consultation activities that were undertaken and the feedback gathered during the engagement period.

BACKGROUND

The City of Victor Harbor has a number of plans it has developed to assist with the management of the Council area. One of these plans is the Community Plan which sets out aspirations for the City of Victor Harbor and what needs to be in place to achieve these aspirations.

All councils are required to review their strategic management plans (Community Plan) within two years of an election. Following the November 2018 election, the City of Victor Harbor has commenced a review and is preparing a new Community Plan.

Based on feedback and ideas collected through a broad range of public consultation activities over the past few years, along with other research, the Council has put together draft strategic directions for its new Community Plan. The strategic directions include a set of aspirations which describe what we want Victor Harbor to be like now and in the future, as well as a number of strategies that set out what needs to be in place to achieve our aspirations.

To make sure Council is on the right track with the strategic directions, it sought feedback from the community to ensure they broadly reflect their priorities and find out if there are any gaps. The consultation also provided an opportunity to hear about the actions the community would like to see to achieve the aspirations for Victor Harbor.

CONSULTATION METHODOLOGY

The community consultation period for the Community Plan strategic directions ran from Thursday, 23 January 2020 until Friday, 14 February 2020.

The City of Victor Harbor collected the views of the community through a number of different methods including:

- Connect cycle / walking paths into loops
- Victor Harbor already has a great community culture but it relies on a lot of volunteers so this needs to be planned for in the future
- Dedicated gopher trails in the city centre
- Kleinig's Hill requires footpath both sides (busy road)
 e.g. 1. Strawberry Hill Road would connect Hindmarsh Road trails, Aquatic Centre,
 Encounter Bikeway, Beyond paths and two schools. Great! 2. Coast pathway along
 surveyed road rather than back street (Granite Grove)
- More footpaths that connect to one and other in the CBD
- Lights at the skate park (security and access)
- o Council needs to be more proactive in communication
- Safety signs at dangerous swimming areas (e.g. Petrel Cove) need to be in language which people who are scarcely literate in English will fully understand (avoid a word like 'adjacent'). People who drowned at Petrel Cove were not English speakers so a more prominent visual icon is needed
- Some councils provide home services to the elderly such as changing light bulbs (hiring an electrician to change a bulb is costly. If unaffordable it doesn't get done and you end up with a hazardous home environment)
- Open minded approaches to engaging the community. Differing ideas should be welcomed and not sidelined or considered not valid

SURVEY RESPONSES

During the consultation period the Council received 51 quick survey responses and 18 detailed survey responses. Predominantly the responses were completed online via www.yoursay.victor.sa.gov.au, there was one hard copy submission and three emails direct to Council.

The full set of responses are provided in Appendix 1.

CONVERSATION KITS

This was the first time that a conversation kit was developed to assist gather community feedback. A total of 3 groups submitted responses using this survey tool. The conversations were facilitated by Elected Members (Councillor Hayles - x2; Councillor Robertson - x 1).

The responses are provided at Appendix 2.

COUNCIL COMMITTEES

The draft strategic directions were also sent to Council committees, working groups and advisory groups for comment.

Some of the groups who met during the consultation period discussed the proposed strategic directions and provided feedback.

Fleurieu Region Community Services Advisory Committee

At the 11 February 2020 Fleurieu Community Services Advisory Committee meeting the following feedback was provided:

- The Committee liked that what was proposed was centred around people
- · Connection is about providing both opportunities and facilities
- Consider intergenerational connection opportunities
- Places for young people to gather and connect
- Plans and strategies to be acknowledged within the Community Plan include the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan and Regional Public Health Plan – key recommendations from these plans could provide actions
- Consideration should be given to inclusion of guiding principles within the Community. For example: access for all, integrity
- Discussion about Victor Harbor's role as the service centre of the Southern Fleurieu Peninsula
- Need to be clear about what Local Government can achieve
- Climate change should be about mitigation as well as adaptation
- Education is missing from the environment aspiration
- Aspiration 6 is not just about efficiencies but also needs to consider service. For example, how
 can we get a good service in an efficient way
- Customer service strategy could be expanded caring, consideration in the way we provide service
- Consider opportunities to meet unmet need in the community. For example, grants, flexibility for Council to respond to unmet needs or gaps in service, responsive and innovative
- In the roles of council table, the leadership role should be expanded to describe the ways that Council shows leadership

Youth Advisory Committee

At the 18 February 2020 Youth Advisory Committee meeting, there was discussion about what members see as priorities for Victor Harbor's future. A summary of the discussion and ideas is provided below:

- Youth Space somewhere safe to hang out, see bands, creative space, access to services and workshops/sessions. Example provided was the Woodville Road Space (a big shed with dividing doors)
- More things targeting young people and families, for example a drive in theatre, roller blading, and arcade.
- More regular and all area traineeships within Council
- TAFE to offer more maybe a specialised campus
- Transport safe youth transport, use train track for community transport, affordable transport between towns
- Safe emergency housing for all people and affordable youth housing
- More employment opportunities for young people
- The new planned Arts and Culture Centre to include young people and to stay affordable for groups to use and to have storage
- Open mic and music events, activities in existing events for young volunteers to learn those skills
- Use the Recreation Centre for more for things like Roller Skating, Roller Derby, indoor inflatables, maybe temp plastic flooring, gymnastics in new Rec centre so the area can be a multi-use space
- Expand carnival area on the Foreshore and change it around, Giant Inflatable things during summer and indoor in Winter
- Creating Victor Harbor to be beach Hahndorf, beach themed markets, food trucks festivals, closed street party for Christmas, twilight fares, Christmas carols move back to Warland Reserve or somewhere else like the Footy oval
- Schoolies to be a less destructive-environmental issue
- Beach clean-up days, clean up Australia Day make a day of it led by Council e.g. Prizes make competition
- Council to lobby for transport creating metro buses linking us to city similar to Mt Barker (express buses and regular public transport every couple of hours)
- YACSA youth unemployment no expected drop over Christmas and summer, entry level jobs are being taken by skilled workers, automation is taking away jobs. Discussion was had about this being a state-wide problem

THEMES TO FEEDBACK

While the feedback gathered during the consultation period represented a broad range of views and ideas, there were some common themes that emerged. These themes are summarised below:

- It is highly important that Victor Harbor's character is protected (heritage, natural environment, seaside town feel, lifestyle, development controls)
- There is a desire for more activation in the town centre. This includes looking at initiatives that fill vacant shops (enabling pop-ups or attracting new businesses), more events or markets, closing the Mainstreet on occasion for events that draw people into the town centre, and enhancing the night-time economy. Encouraging pedestrian traffic within the town centre to return the space as a place for people was also mentioned a number of times
- Walking and bicycle paths were mentioned frequently, highlighting their importance to many in the community. This is in terms of providing connection to places, contributing to our healthy and active lifestyle, and as a tourism offering
- Employment and job creation is highly important for many in the community, and this also spans into creating jobs that aren't seasonal (more permanent employment options). It was also a common suggestion that action needs to be taken to 'winter proof' the Victor Harbor economy
- More needs to be done to support the establishment and expansion of businesses locally, with suggestions that Council can assist by cutting 'red tape' and enabling businesses
- More things for young people and families was also a common sentiment, balanced against
 ensuring there is support for our older population. Education opportunities to keep young
 people in the local area was raised in a number of different forums, particularly a desire to
 see a broader range of courses offered at the local TAFE campus
- Increase the focus on greening the council area by planting more trees down residential streets, along with the importance of protecting and enhancing our rivers. There was also a number of comments about preparing for emergencies, specifically bushfire prevention actions like clearing verges and trimming over hanging trees
- The need for better public transport in the Council area that supports both young and old population was raised including services along the south coast (between Victor Harbor and Goolwa) as well as to and from Adelaide
- Access for all was also a common sentiment. This was mentioned in terms of disability access to beaches, better footpaths and connection, access to public spaces and services


- Opportunities to engage in arts and culture activities was also seen as important. This
 included support for the development of an arts and culture centre but also for arts and
 culture activities that support a vibrant community culture
- The feedback also highlighted that the Council needs to clearly show how it is achieving its aspirations, and focus on accountability and transparency

CONCLUSION

The first stage of public consultation undertaken for the development of the City of Victor Harbor Community Plan indicated that generally the Council is on the right track with its strategic directions.

Developing the actions for 2020-2023 that sit under the strategic directions is the next step in the process. This will be undertaken through the consideration of the feedback provided by the community, along with discussions with Council staff.

A further report will be provided to Elected Members at the 16 March 2020 workshop with suggested actions for consideration and review.




